## ERUV TAVSHILIN

### Wednesday, October 2nd - Eruv Tavshilin

Instructions for an Eruv Tavshilin and how to make one:

An eruv tavshilin is necessary to allow any type of preparations for Shabbat to be made on the second day of Yom Tov (Yom Tov Sheini) for Shabbat. Preparations for Shabbat cannot be made on the first day of Yom Tov.

The head of the household, or a designee, should set aside a baked item such as a challah roll, and a cooked item such as meat, fish, or eggs (i.e. a food that is eaten along with bread). He or she should then recite the blessing of “Baruch Atoh Ado-noi E-loheinu Melech Ha'Olam Asher Kidshanu B'mitzvotav V'tzivanu Al Mitzvat Eruv” and the proclamation (found on page 654 of the Artscroll Siddur). This proclamation states that the cooked and baked items should permit us to continue baking, cooking, lighting a flame from an existing fire and do all the necessary preparations from Yom Tov to Shabbat.

It is now viewed as though meal preparations for Shabbat have already begun before Yom Tov and Shabbat meal preparations may continue on Friday Yom Tov, Erev Shabbat. It is customary to eat the foods of the eruv tavshilin on Shabbat.

**Please note:** It is more important to have an understanding of what is being said than to use the traditional Hebrew and Aramaic languages and so it would be permissible to recite the text in a native tongue if neither language is familiar.

### Wednesday, October 16th - Eruv Tavshilin

#### **Instructions for an Eruv Tavshilin and how to make one:**

An eruv tavshilin is necessary to allow any type of preparations for Shabbat to be made on the second day of Yom Tov (Friday) for Shabbat. Preparations for Shabbat cannot be made on the first day of Yom Tov.

The head of the household, or a designee, should set aside a baked item such as a challah roll, and a cooked item such as meat, fish, or eggs (i.e. a food that is eaten along with bread). He or she should then recite the blessing of “Baruch Atoh Ado-noi E-loheinu Melech Ha'Olam Asher Kidshanu B'mitzvotav V'tzivanu Al Mitzvat Eruv” and the proclamation (found on page 654 of the Artscroll Siddur). This proclamation states that the cooked and baked items should permit us to continue baking, cooking, lighting a flame from an existing fire and do all the necessary preparations from Yom Tov to Shabbat.
